. Old business

- a. **Lake Study Grants for 2015.** No activity
- b. **Lake Study Grants for 2016.** No activity but Nick is paying bills for this one. \$3,707.50 is due for field work. There were 5 passengers on the Lynx and Papoose floating workshop today. There was concern about one property with lawn to the shore, stone walls, and irrigation using lake water. A similar problem is on Wildcat Lake with the manicured lawn attracting geese which are then a nuisance with their poop on all docks and which creates Swimmer's Itch for humans. **The zoning board has been out 5 times; there has been no mitigation but they can't get a permit.....**
- c. **Lake Study Grant for 2017-** There is still \$40,939.50 to spend on this grant.
- d. **Other –**
 - 1. Dean Premo has reported that Stateline Lake has No curly leaf pondweed. It was misidentified by others. Also, terrestrials found on all sturdies will be recorded with GPS points even though this is not within White Water's scope.
 - 2. Gary P. reported that he had a volunteer work force pull purple loosestrife at the landing at Little Presque Isle Lake. He reminded us that it needs to be pulled from June – the first 2 weeks of August.
 - 3. Fritz brought up the issue of Red Bass Lake. It is the headwater lake of the Presque Isle Watershed. Could it be included in the grant this December? There is a canoe slide-in landing there. Red Bass Lake is connected to Lynx Lake at a culvert. There is one permanent resident, 3 other houses, and lots for sale on Red Bass.

New Business	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. Musky Classic September 7 – 9 (1/2 day on Friday and on Sunday.) Make sure you have CBCW inspectors on hand. b. The second addition of “Through the Looking Glass” is available through Cathy Higley for \$15. Nick is getting one for the Crab Lake CBCW inspector and for the Adopt-a-Shoreline person as well as this is a great identification resource. WE should find out if other lake associations want them. Perhaps Chuck Hayes could get them from Cathy and get them to Presque Isle. Sarah asked for 2. c. Other <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1. June reported there are big, new CBCW signs at Papoose landing. 2. Sarah wondered about having wash stations for boats. Her family likes to go from lake to lake but there are no facilities for washing most of the time. They have been located by the DNR (who owns them) at Trout and Ike Walton lakes probably because of the incidence of spiny water fleas there. Sarah wondered if a permanent station or a designated place to go that has an available hose in PI would be a good idea. She is going to research this idea. 3. Carlin Lake update. The Carlin Club LLC has 2 appeals going: 1. To challenge the Vilas County Board of Adjustment’s ruling against them; and 2. to the appellate court in WI against the 9th Circuit Court’s ruling against them. Carlin Lake Association will let other associations and individuals know of any public hearings that are scheduled for either appeal. We thank all for their support. 4. Nick reported on the fundraising activities of the Crab Lake Foundation that has been used for: lake association activities; as seed money to buy land (currently their 501-C3 owns 130 acres and 4,000 feet of shoreline); to pay for their landing inspector; and to provide a fund if invasives should be found in Crab Lake. They are creating a brochure for people to encourage them to put the foundation into their wills. They generate dollars by selling a yearly calendar, having a silent auction at their annual meeting, and donations. d. Next meeting is September 11, 2018 at 7 PM in the community center.
